Title: Introducing the Online Tutorial on the 2012 Additions to the Australian ESOS Act

Abstract

As a response to the *Baird Review* a revision of the ESOS Act took place in March 2012, that

- Introduced the Tuition Protection Service
- Introduced limits on pre-paid fees and the need for designated accounts
- Defined provider default obligations and
- Strengthened the report keeping requirements for providers.

These changes took effect on 1 July 2012.

AEI provided money for ISANA to develop an online tutorial that explains these changes more fully and explores implications of their application. This tutorial will stand on the ISANA website beside the present online tutorial which deals with the original ESOS Act, its previous revisions and the National Code.

In this workshop, the most recent changes to the Act and their implications for ISANA members will be discussed and parts of the tutorial will be demonstrated.
