

Digital Destruction and the Future of International Education in Australia

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This presentation examines:

(i) the impact of information technology on student learning: Moore's Law foreshadows the doubling power/ halving in price of IT every 2 years; this is really being felt in some industries (not least the media where I have worked) and so we need to be alert to the faint signals of change now hitting student learning

(ii) some suggestions on how Australian education providers can respond to this challenge by improving the direct student experience and the techniques necessary to gain acceptance of these ideas by their campus colleagues.

iii) this presentation encourages education providers to look at alternative avenues of reaching students and embracing ways that technology can enhance areas such as student orientation programs prior to arrival and post arrival inclusion programs to assist student with network building and attaining a positive student experience.
